## Session 1: Software Miscellany or Connecting Better with your PC or Mac with Pierke Bosschieter (50 minutes)

Most days we use indexing software, MS Word, and maybe a task manager or bookkeeping program. But does it end there? Could you be more productive if you had a good note-taking app to keep notes on indexing and the subject matter you usually work with? Have you automated your backup system? Different brands of PDF software have different perks and drawbacks, but which one best fits your workflow? A publisher you worked with ten years ago is contacting you again. Can you quickly find your email correspondence from 2014? Having trouble calculating a good quote? There's software to assist you with that too. Do you have a good timekeeping system to check if your estimates are accurate?

There's a lot of good software out there and some of it isn't expensive or difficult to use. This presentation has suggestions about what's possible and where to look. The goal is to give you ideas to make the non-indexing elements of your business more productive and manageable.



**Pierke Bosschieter** has been indexing since 2005. She specializes in scholarly books on the three Abrahamic religions and Middle Eastern studies. She's a coordinator of ICRIS and on the editorial board of The Indexer. A driving force behind NIN, she mentors beginning indexers and works to raise awareness of indexing in the Dutch publishing industry.

# Session 2: A Worthwhile Pursuit?: Embedded Indexing Today and in the Future with Enid L. Zafran and Stephen Ullstrom (50 minutes)

Embedded indexing is here to stay, but are indexers embracing it? Enid Zafran and Stephen Ullstrom survey a range of active indexers to get a feel for the current state of embedded indexing. Why are indexers choosing—or not—to offer embedded indexing services? What are the benefits to your business, and what are the pitfalls? How can embedded indexing be improved? What does the indexing future look like? Enid and Stephen consider these questions and more, providing insights on this indexing niche.



**Stephen Ullstrom** is an award-winning indexer living in Edmonton, AB, and the author of Book Indexing: A Step-by-Step Guide.



**Enid L. Zafran** started indexing in 1975 and presently runs her full-time business, Indexing Partners LLC, in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. In addition to running two in-house indexing departments in her career, she has written and lectured extensively about indexing. She offers a Boot Camp for newer indexers and has trained more than 100 indexers in 40+ years. Her business specializes in indexing scholarly texts in the fields of law, art, social sciences, history, politics and international relations, literary criticism, philosophy (ugh!), and religion. She is also a founding member of the Institute of Certified Indexers.

#### **Movement Session with Carol Fellowes (30 minutes)**



# Session 3: Connections Between Qualitative Research and Indexing with Iva Cheung (50 minutes)

Qualitative research methods like thematic analyses use a process that has striking similarities with indexing. Qualitative researchers often use software to track themes and understand the relationship between themes they've identified. These programs include NVivo and Quirkos, and although they may be overkill for most indexing projects, some of their features could be interesting to indexers. This presentation will include a brief overview of qualitative research and its overlap with indexing techniques and a demonstration of qualitative software features that indexers may find interesting or useful.



**Iva Cheung** is a cookbook indexer, Certified Professional Editor, plain language trainer, and mental health policy researcher. She uses qualitative analysis methods in her research and serves on the Plain Language Technical Committee for Accessibility Standards Canada. Find her at www.ivacheung.com.

Alex has spent time in Canada (City of Québec), Scotland (Glasgow), Australia (Narara, north of Sydney), and Spain (Mojácar and Barcelona) and is heading to England this year.

"Most indexers didn't plan to become an indexer. They were librarians, editors, or writers, and filled a need. Starting out is scary. Building a practice is challenging. Maintaining a long career is the stuff dreams are made of. But it's possible. I started from humble beginnings, found my way into the arts as a matter of survival, and through my storytelling and puzzle skills, fell into an indexing career that has lasted much longer than I ever thought it would. If I can do it, so can you."

## Session 4: Authors Amok!: Indexing Multi-Authored Texts with Enid L. Zafran (50 minutes)

This session looks at the challenge of indexing texts where each chapter has a different author. This occurs in textbooks, conference proceedings, museum catalogues, and other works. It's a quick and easy way to get a book out—but it's not so quick and easy to get out an index! Enid will provide examples of issues and solutions that will save you time and headaches when you tackle a multi-author book. Special attention will be given to vocabulary control, name problems, double posting, and cross-referencing as well as strategies for working efficiently.
